We all need a break for our brain, even our children. What are brain breaks? A short opportunity to allow kids to just be kids, refocus their thinking and attention, and allow for timed breaks to play and engage upon their own interest during cognitive learning! Learn about brain development research and enjoy a variety of examples through hands-on demonstrations and small group learning activities. This will allow for WHAT "brain breaks" entail and should look like in the classroom setting. Receive a hand-out of ideas, play activities for transitions and enjoy collaborating with peers and demonstrating the process and benefit of brain breaks.


