Live Animal Cameras

Track the habits of beluga whales with the <u>Georgia Aquarium's</u> <u>Beluga whale-cam</u> or African Wildlife with this <u>African Wildlife</u>
Cam or Puppies with this <u>Puppy Cam</u>. <u>Explore.org</u> has a vast array of web cameras tracking animals from around the world. If you scroll down on the Expore Live Cams website you can see all the live streams! Students can investigate how often they see the animals, their motions or movements, their groupings. This could spark further research about different animals. Recommended for middle schoolers! Supports scientific inquiry skills.

Museum Tours

Go to a virtual museum or exhibit. Students can discover exhibits close to home or far away in Europe! Which was their favorite piece of artwork? Which was their least favorite? May prompt discussion or research about the artists or museum workers. Who curates exhibits? How do museums make an exhibit come to life? Recommended for middle schoolers! Supports creative exploration.
