Our mission is to advance student lives by empowering them to engage in today's economic opportunities and equipping them with the education, professional skills, and career training they need to obtain livable wage employment in the communities in which they live.



- Explicitly allows districts to serve dropouts through the Optional Flexible School Day Program (OFSDP)
 - Statute can be found Education Code 29.081 (d) – (e - 2)
 - Section of 11.6.4 of the Texas Attendance Accounting Handbook
- Programmatic Components:
 - Programs may be offered online
 - Allows districts to partner with expert organizations to implement dropout recovery programs
 - Lays out specific requirement for online and blended dropout recovery programs

An online program must have:

- ✓ Curriculum or credentials that relate directly to employment opportunities in Texas;
- ✓ Employ faculty with a baccalaureate or advance degree;
- ✓ Provide an academic coach and local advocate for each student;
- ✓ Use an individual learning plan;
- ✓ Provide monthly reports;
- ✓ Perform satisfactorily according to alternative school accountability measures.

Recapture for course completions



- **Under New Online Dropout Recovery Rules for the OFSDP the annual ADA for missing students is based on course completions not attendance**
- **Student has to complete 2 courses in a semester for district to recapture 50% of missing ADA**
- **Student has to complete 4 courses in a semester for district to recapture 100% of ADA for semester and be counted as fulltime student**
- **Student has to complete a total of 8 courses for the school year to trigger full recapture of ADA back to the district**

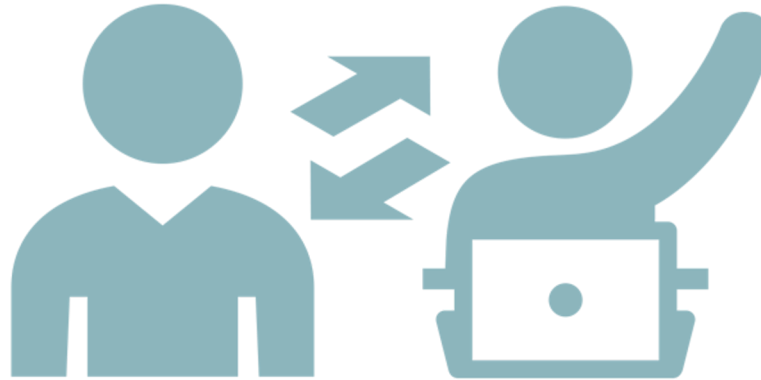

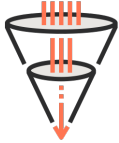

- \$30,800,000 (Missing ADA based on 5,000 students)
- \$3,080,000 (Graduation Alliance Average Recapture & Graduation Projection for estimated 500 students)

Cost Neutral Utilizing OFSD-DR



The Program is **cost neutral** utilizing the Optional Flexible School Day Online Dropout Recovery Program. There are no up-front costs and Graduation Alliance assumes all risk. The district is only charged if a student is found and successfully competes courses that trigger new ADA funding back to the school district.

Graduation Alliance is accredited by Cognia formally known as AdvancEd.

NCAA Approved Courses

The QM research-based tool is updated annually with the latest evidence and best practices in online and blended learning design.
