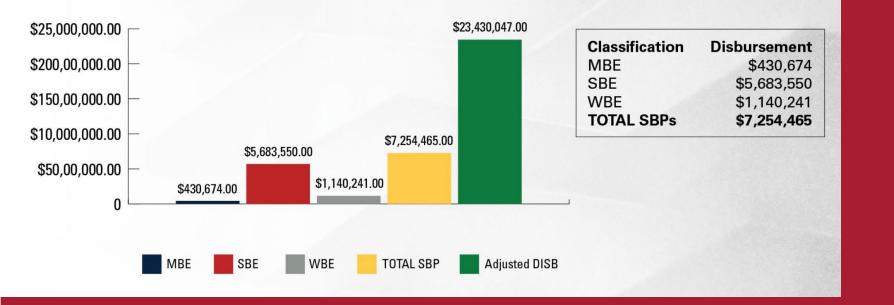

# **Small Business Program**

#### SURVEY DATA

To learn more about the racial and ethnic make-up of the vendors that comprise the SBP, it was determined that a survey would be created and sent to the 48 SBP vendors who identified as MBE. The survey was created using the Qualtrics program and submitted to each vendor via electronic mail. The survey was created purposely short, with only four questions (see Appendix) to optimize responses.

#### Self-Reported MBE Status

Of the 48 SBP vendors who were sent the survey, 2 error messages were returned indicating the email address was incorrect or has changed. So, in the end, only 46 MBE vendors received the survey, 30 responded. This is a response rate of approximately 65%, a good response rate and representation according to research (Wu, Zhao & Fils-Aime, 2022).

Of the 30 respondents, 24 (80%) indicated they were an MBE in 2023 and 6 (20%) indicated they were NOT an MBE in 2023. None of the respondents answered unsure as to their MBE status for 2023.

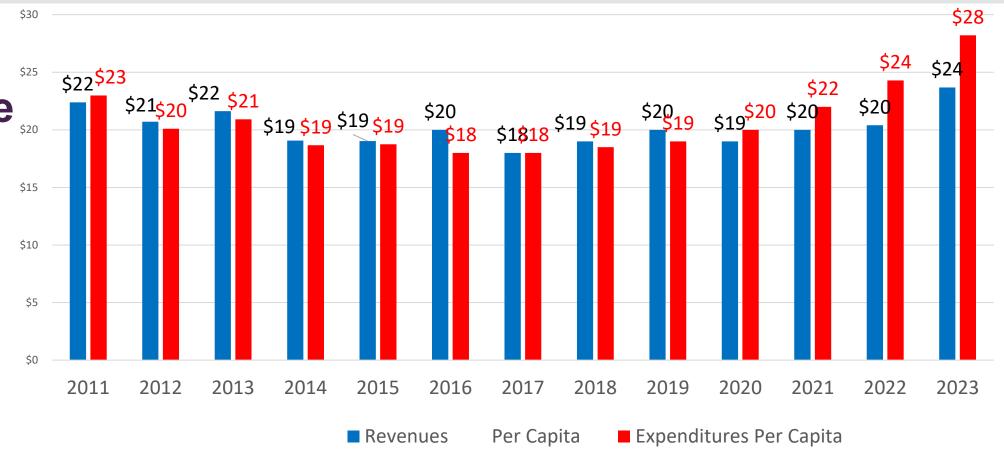

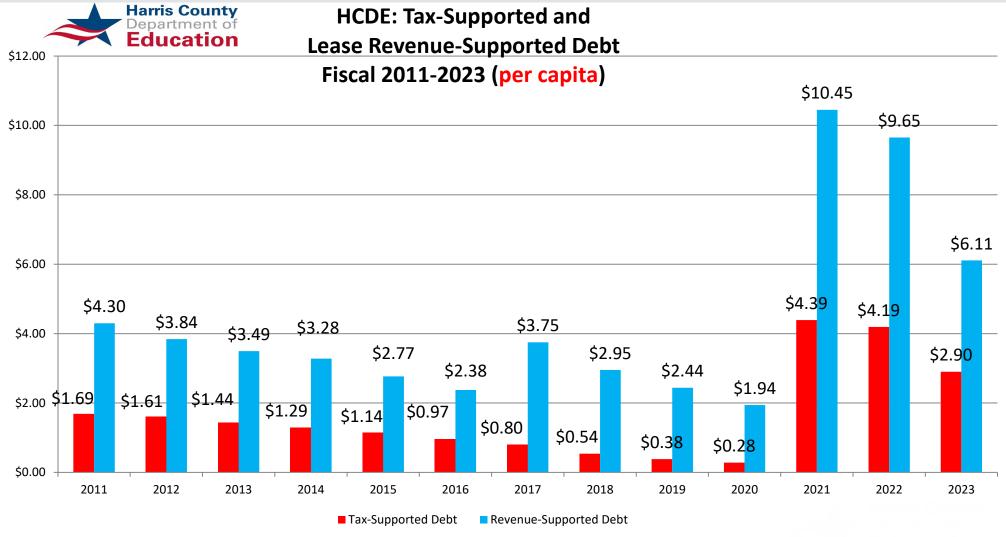

Revenue/ Expenditure Per Capita





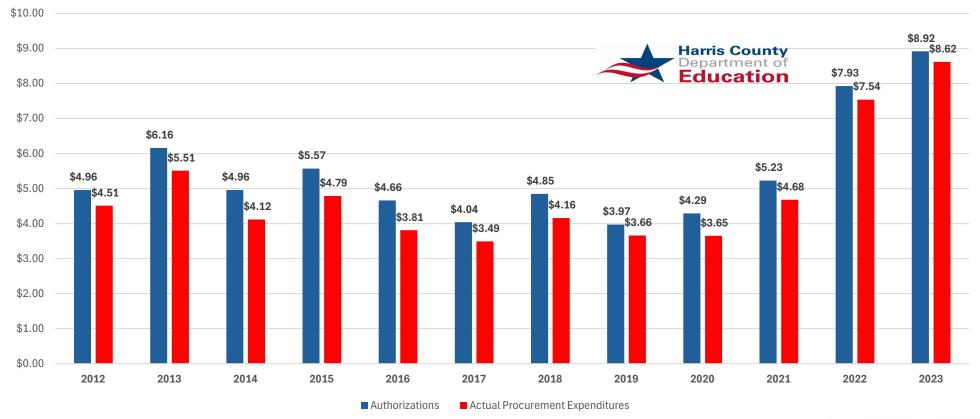
Debt Per Capita
