




Graduates can meet criteria in three ways. 1) Meet TSIA criteria as described in College Readiness 2) Complete and earn credit for at least two advanced/dual credit classes in 2015 or 2016 3) Enroll in CTE courses in a 4 year plan taking 2 or more CTE courses for 3 or more credits in 2016 school year.

STUDENTCOMPARISON SAT/ACT




Greater percentage of Black and Hispanic Title 1 students take the SAT/ACT than non-Title 1 students.
