HCDE's Therapy Services: A True Leader in the Field

Therapy Services director Jean Polichino recently co-presented an all-day institute- **An Introduction to School-Based Occupational Therapy**. At the conference, HCDE Therapy Services staff also presented a two-hour session, **Introducing TxSpot**, to occupational therapy practitioners and professional students. Other HCDE Therapy Services managers attending the event promoted occupational therapy employment opportunities with HCDE.

The division also recently provided management consultation to Occupational Therapy and Physical Therapy staff in Humble ISD. Topics included therapy service delivery for students with disabilities under Section 504, as well as a review of the district model for Physical Therapy services under IDEA, and also within a Response to Intervention (RtI) framework.

While the division has several other commitments on the horizon, Polichino also represented HCDE as she participated in a panel discussion for approximately 45 Masters of Occupational Therapy students at Texas Woman's University. There, she served as an expert resource in the question and answer session pertaining to the management of occupational therapy services for children.
