Again, thank you for your interest in HCDE and I hope you enjoy this issue of **The Connector**. Have a great weekend.

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
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# PROGRAM CONNECTIONS

## HCDE divisions gain 33 awards at Texas School Public Relations Association Conference

Harris County Department of Education teams earned 33 awards at the Texas School Public Relations Association 53rd Annual Conference held February 23-26 in San Antonio, Texas. Altogether, Client Development Services, Communications and Public Information and Technology earned one “best of category,” 13 gold awards, 12 silver awards and seven bronze awards.



The association announced that 970 entries were received this year. TSPRA is comprised of 850 members who are primarily public information and communications professionals who serve public school districts and education organizations of Texas.

The top award earned by HCDE was for a video produced for the Center for Afterschool, Summer and Expanded Learning, or CASE for Kids. The Out-of-School Time Message was produced by videographer Daniel Villarreal. 
Thirteen gold awards were presented. Three were delivered to Client Development Services for the Choice Partners Leader’s Choice Newsletter; its invitation to the HCDE Healthy School Environments Symposium; and a marketing campaign for Choice Partners Cooperative Annual Vendor Exhibit.

Communications and Public Information (CPI) division earned five gold awards for the HCDE Website Marketing Campaign, the Early Childhood Winter Conference special event planning, the Head Start Annual Report, the Happy Holidays Card and the HCDE Employee Handbook. CPI earned three gold awards for CASE for Kids deliverables, including the Girls on the Run photo, the Find Yourself in Afterschool flier and the Pathways to Success brochure.

Two gold awards were also presented to the Technology division for the Jason Project/Pasadena ISD’s Jackson Middle School and the CASE Out-of-School Time Message videos.


## Students, Faculty, and Staff Celebrate Black History Month at ABC West
