Stafford MSD College and Career Center

Education, business, and community leaders (including a representative from HCDE) were on hand for a breakfast presentation and tour of Stafford MSD's College and Career Center. Stafford MSD's superintendent, Dr. Robert Bostic laid out his vision for the Career Center and announced partnerships with Texas Southern University and Houston Community College. Dr. John Rudley and Dr. Fena Garza were also on hand to give further details about dual credit and scholarship programs. After the presentation, student ambassadors gave quest a walking tour of the new College and Career Center facility.

39 Harris County Students Gain National Awards, Scholarships through Scholastic Art & Writing Awards Sponsored Regionally by HCDE

HCDE Scholastic Art & Writing Awards medalists will be wellrepresented in New York City this June as our Harris County students gained 39 medals through national judging. Medalists were announced March 16.

Sam Rayburn senior Vanessa Sosa earned national acclaim and a \$10,000 scholarship as one of eight art portfolio Gold Key Medalists chosen from a field of 1,000. Sosa earned two additional Gold Key Medals for her individual entries and a "best in grade" art distinction as a senior. She and her teacher Daniel Reyna gain \$500 and \$250 respectively for that award.

St. John's Upper School tenth grader Yuming Ren earned the award for "best in grade" from the thousands of entries from tenth graders nationally. She and her teacher Dan Havel earn \$500 and \$250 respectively.



Additional notable awards go to Jose Gutierrez, an eleventh grader from Davis High School in Aldine Independent School District. Writer Isabella draper of St. John's Upper School earns an American Vision Award for her personal essay entitled Defying Expiration.

National medalists represent the following districts: Aldine, Cypress Fairbanks, Deer Park, Houston, Huffman, Katy, Klein, Pasadena, Spring Branch and Tomball. Private schools earning medals are The Village School and St. John's Upper School.

(As a special note, we congratulate Linda Dixon, daughter of Kelly and Elvira Dixon. The Pasadena ISD Bondy Middle School student earned a Silver Medal for her mixed media piece dedicated to her father.)

43 Educators Attend Math Institute: Aligning the Pre-K Guidelines

Forty-three pre-k and kindergarten teachers and administrators attended the Math Institute: Aligning the Pre-K Guidelines to the New TEKS workshop at HCDE. Co-presenters were HCDE Director of Mathematics Curriculum Nicole Shanahan and math consultant Kristen Allen. The workshop featured 56 centers and eight small group instruction lessons along with 16 whole group lessons.

Online Safety Program Funded by Digital Trust Foundation to Cirrus Learn at Cy-Fair ISD Helps Teachers Guide Students to Safely Navigate Online Learning

Cirrus Learn Online, a program launched through the technology division at Harris County Department of Education, gained a \$187,500 grant on March 25 through the Digital Trust Foundation to teach positive online citizenship behaviors. The grant targets middle school students engaged in an online learning management system in the Cypress Fairbanks Independent School District.



This train-the-trainer safety model equips teachers with effective strategies for online safety, privacy, and digital citizenship. Those skills are passed on to other teachers to spread the best practices in digital safety. The program trains 18 middle school teachers and two district-level staff. The training, which will directly affect approximately 3,000 students, is an essential asset in light of today's techology as it relates to students.

"We created digital lessons focused on safety, privacy and citizenship that will help these students as they access the Internet for their lessons," said David McGeary, manager of Cirrus Learn Online. Cirrus Learn was created two years ago by HCDE as a needs initiative for local K-12 school districts to help educate students and teachers on digital safety, citizenship, and privacy in online learning spaces.

Lessons focus on privacy issues, and particularly on the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act. Students learn to develop "net etiquette" in the classroom by communicating professionally through email. Curriculum focuses on students learning the digital skills necessary to be productive in the "connected world" and strategies they can use to build a positive online presence.

Adult Education, Capital Idea Houston Featured on KCOH AM with Larry Payne

Adult Education's Angela Johnson was a featured on KCOH AM with Larry Payne, in collaboration with Capital Idea Houston. The collaborative featured 10 weeks of integrated education and training classes held at HCDE. Students focused on skills necessary to gain entry level positions in construction-related industries and it also allowed students to continue working on earning their GEDs. Students showed significant gains in both career and academic curriculum. The classes boasted a 98 percent attendance rate.

financial literacy skills of high school students. Shanahan



is working with mathematics cohorts from the Texas Association for Supervisors of Mathematics and the Texas Council on Economic Education to review and recommend changes. She considers it an honor to be chosen as a mathematics instructional leader on the team which met at HCDE on March 25.
