Grant awards to continue as 8 organizations gain \$80,000 in afterschool funding from City Connections initiative with City of Houston, CASE for Kids

Eight Houston organizations will each receive afterschool funding through June 2015 ranging from \$5,000 to \$22,500 as part of an ongoing funding project from the City of Houston. The collaboration between the Center



for Afterschool, Summer and Extended Learning, or **CASE for Kids**, a division of Harris County Department of Education and the City of Houston spreads \$550,000 between all 11 city council districts. Grant applications from Houston organizations continue to be accepted through April 6, 2015.

The first wave of money awarded to the eight organizations totals \$80,031 of the \$550,000 appropriated for youth. Awards are announced on the first Monday of each month. The final award will be announced May 4. Funds are available for use from January 2015 through June 2015.

City Connections is an innovative initiative spearheaded by Houston City Councilmember C.O. Bradford last summer and CASE for Kids. The out-ofschool time funding is intended to help fight juvenile crime and to promote child safety during the hours of 3-6 p.m. during the school year when parents are working and in the summertime. The funding is especially needed due to decreased state and federal funding streams which previously supported afterschool locally.

Chavez High School is one of eight organizations awarded the first wave of grants in afterschool funding from the City Connections initiative with the City of Houston and CASE for Kids.

Alief Family YMCA (Community Outreach Missions Education Team), \$11,250, District F (77083); Alief Independent School District (Martin Elementary and Miller Intermediate), \$22,500, District F (77072 and 77082); Chinese Community Center, \$11,250, District F (77036); Citizen Schools Texas (Patrick Henry Middle School), \$5,000, District B (77093); College Community Center (Spring Woods and Northbrook high schools in Spring Branch Independent School District), \$5,000, District A (77080); Cypress-Fairbanks Independent School District (Bane Elementary School), \$5,031, District A (77040); Houston Independent School District (Chavez High School), \$15,000, District I (77017); and Solutions for Better Living (iServe Fifth Ward), \$5,000, District B (77020).
