The daylong event held at the Kingdom Builders' Center, 6011 West Orem in south Houston through Harris County Department of Education, features 90-plus workshop options for early childhood educators. Specialization workshops focus on subjects such as behavior management, math, science, literacy, technology, bilingual and dual language education, technology, art, and music.

Keynote speaker is award-winning author Eric Litwin, who inspires audiences with creative classroom techniques through his guitar, harmonica, voice, and prose. "Mr. Eric" is author to a series of childhood best-sellers featuring the first four "Pete the Cat" books.



Keynote speaker for bilingual education teachers is veteran early childhood educator and presenter Mike Longoria who presents: "Singing, Moving and Learning."

The conference is a longtime tradition which attracts generations of early education learners. Along with networking, the conference features an extensive vendor fair with instructional materials and educational toys.

Financial Reporting for FY2013-2014

This week, HCDE's Business Services division released both the Annual Financial Management Report and Single Audit Report. HCDE received an unmodified opinion from the external auditors on the financial statements as of August 31, 2014. This means that the financial statements are free from material misstatements and can be relied on by its users. The total increase in the fund balance for the





year was \$1.8M, which was an 8% increase from last year. Also, HCDE had no findings or questioned costs, and received an unmodified opinion on its grants and single audit report.
