The ribbon-cutting ceremony begins at 2:30 p.m., followed by a tour of the new 5,700-square-foott center located next to the Journey of Faith United Methodist Church.

Head Start, a federal program, empowers preschool children ages 3-5 and their families with school readiness skills. HCDE provides services for families in northeast Harris County through 16 Head Start centers which serve 1,250 students.

"We are proud to share our services within the Humble community and look forward to partnering with Humble businesses and local agencies to strengthen the community," said Venetia Peacock, senior director of HCDE Head Start.



HCDE Head Start develops relationships with school districts, social service agencies, local businesses, universities and other community entities to provide services to Head Start families. Centers include Humble as well as Channelview, Fifth Ward, Dogan, J.D. Walker, Tidwell, Coolwood, Baytown, Crosby, La Porte, Barrett Station, Compton, Sheffield, Fonwood, Pugh and San Jacinto College.

Applications are now being accepted for enrollment at all 16 HCDE Head Start centers, including Humble. Services include early childhood instruction, meals during program hours, family services, developmental screenings, disability services and mental wellness services.
