It was yet another productive week at HCDE. As mentioned in the last issue of **The Connector**, I spent last Thursday through Sunday at both the TABSE Superintendent's Think Tank session as well as the TASA/TASB Conference which ran nearly concurrent with each other. Both events were held here in Houston and were excellent opportunities for professional growth and for HCDE to receive visibility in the public education community. The conferences offered excellent opportunities for networking and they allowed me to continue to shed light on the programs and services HCDE offers its client school districts. It also allowed for informative discussions surrounding the needs of our client school districts with fellow education executives. During the TASA/TASB Conference, I also attended the Texas Academic Decathlon (TAD) Board Meeting. The governing body of TAD consists of 12 superintendents from across the state, of which I remain a member.

I returned to the office on Monday of this week and began with a meeting with my Executive Leadership Team, followed by an IMPACT meeting. As previously mentioned, IMPACT is a professional development group designed especially for school board members throughout Harris County. Today, I am traveling to Laredo, Texas to visit the Jose' Valdez High School, a high school for students in recovery from substance abuse and addictions. I will keep you apprised of any unique findings during that visit.



Hundreds of area educators attended workshops at HCDE last week with renowned speakers and presenters Jennifer Serravallo, Jim Walsh "Law Dawg," and Jeff Anderson.

On September 22, more than 300 educators learned to make independent reading time a joyful yet rigorous time of day through the workshop titled, "Reading Strategies for Goal-Directed Instruction."
Until 2012, Serravallo was a

senior staff developer at the Teachers College Reading and Writing Project helping urban, suburban, and rural schools implement exceptional literacy instruction through reading and writing workshops.

Other area administrators, counselors, and special education staff spent the day with Legal Digest's Jim Walsh for the 11th Annual Back-to-School Program. Known as the "Law Dawg," Walsh's workshop featured a comprehensive review of legal developments that will impact the day-to-day operations of public schools from the classroom to the principal's office to the board room.

through several exercises from his book and each teacher received a copy for their respective professional library.
