

Klein ISD Student Teoh Named 2015 National Student Poets Program Semi-finalist Through Scholastic Art & Writing Awards Sponsored Regionally by HCDE

Klein Oak High School junior Julianna Teoh is officially a rising poet and a voice to be reckoned with in the literary world. Teoh was selected as one of 34 semi-finalist nominees for the 2015 National Student Poets Program, the nation's highest honor for youth poets. The program is part of the Scholastic Art & Writing Awards, a national venue for young artists and writers sponsored regionally by Harris County Department of Education. Famous alums of the program include Sylvia Plath, Sarah Jessica Parker, Zac Posen, Robert Redford, Stephen King and Truman Capote.



Teoh, 15, earned both regional and national Scholastic Awards and Medals and traveled to New York City in June to receive a Scholastic Art & Writing Silver Medal. Her poems were judged among 20,000 works of poetry submitted to the Awards.

The National Student Poets Program is supported by the President's Committee on the Arts and the Humanities, a committee which is supported by First Lady Michelle Obama as its honorary first chair. Two other organizations support the program: the Institute of Museum and Library Services and the Alliance for Young Artists & Writers.

Teoh entered the Scholastic Art & Writing Awards in both 2014 and 2015 and earned multiple awards for her prose.

HCDE accepts regional art and writing entries for Scholastic Art and Writing beginning September 16. Students residing in Harris County may enter the awards as public, private, or home school students. Students may register to enter at www.artandwriting.org.
