### 2016 District Affiliate Leadership Conference Kicks Off Regional Scholastic Art & Writing Awards



Sixty art and writing program directors and teachers met to kick off the 2016-2017 regional Scholastic Art & Writing Awards through the 2016 District Affiliate Leadership Conference held

September 30 and hosted by HCDE at the Federal Reserve Bank Houston Branch on Allen Parkway.



The daylong conference was launched to present guidelines for entering student art and writing entries and to allow the fine arts educators to network and share goals ideas for promoting and building the program. Participants included public, charter and private school representatives. Lunch was provided by the Gulf Coast

Educators Federal Credit Union.

As regional sponsors, HCDE's Scholastic Art & Writing Awards is administered by the Teaching and Learning Center with director Andrea Segraves as coordinator. This year Segraves expects a continued rise in entries as the

Scholastic national has allowed unrestricted numbers of entries. Last year over 7,000 art and writing entries were judged by several hundred professional art and writing volunteers.

Segraves announced that Houston will be included in the national traveling Scholastic Art & Writing Show which is showcased at museums throughout the country. The Museum of Fine Arts will host the exhibit from November 1-January 2, with a reception to be announced soon. Work from two Harris County artists will be showcased in the show.



In addition, about a half-dozen student from Harris County have been selected to showcase their art and writing in Washington, D.C. beginning September 16. "The Art. Write.Now.DC" exhibit spans three locations: The U.S. Department of Education, The President's Committee on the Arts and the Humanities and the Institute of Museum and Library Services.


"We are very proud of our Harris County students and the teachers that encourage their creativity," said Segraves.

### Grant Expansion Sought for HCDE Early Head Start



The Center for Grants Development and HCDE Head Start submitted an Early Head Start Expansion and Child Care Partnership Project grant to the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services to serve 32 children at the La Porte and Tidwell Head Start sites and 28 children through collaborations with two to five local child care providers. The requested funding totals \$8 million for five years of service to families. Center for Grants employees Sharvon Pipkins and Joyce Akins worked with Head Start Senior Director Venetia Peacock on the grant project.

### 200 Attend Adult Education Returning Staff Orientation



Two-hundred HCDE Adult Education part-time teachers gathered for a back-to-school information session held in the Conference Center August 20. Director Eduardo Honold shared a Leadership Matters TED Ed video with staff and encouraged teachers to share “lollipop moments.” Lollipop Moments are personal experiences which show the

value of teachers and the differences they make on their students.

Within the Adult Education division, 12 teachers were recognized for years of service to HCDE, including two 25-year employees, one 20-year employee, seven 15-year employees, four 10-year employees and two five-year employees. Teachers also gained required training from the state’s Workforce Solutions, delivered locally by the Houston-Galveston Area Council.

### Divisions Meet to Discuss Collaboration with Houston:revision to Address At-Risk Youth



A new partnership could be on the horizon with nonprofit **Houston:revision**, an organization which connects

“kids on the edge” with mentors, positive peers and life-changing resources. The Research and Evaluation Institute’s (REI) Dr. Jeannette Truxillo and Dr. Andres Garcia met with CEO Charles Rotramel August 24 to discuss future collaborations between several HCDE divisions and a research study conducted by REI to analyze results. Also in attendance were Assistant Superintendent

Jonathan Parker and directors and staff from several HCDE divisions.

**Houston:revision** works to reintegrate gang-affected and adjudicated youth throughout Harris County into their schools, neighborhoods and families.

The meeting focused on three projects: professional development sponsored by the Teaching and Learning Center and the Center for Safe and Secure Schools, piloting the program at one of the Highpoint schools with possible inclusion in afterschool services with CASE for Kids, and sharing research studies and data collection about the program with Research and Evaluation.
